

VOLUSIA SPEEDWAY PARK IS PART OF OUR BYWAY

The Florida Black Bear Scenic Byway is fortunate to have an internationally-known attraction -- Volusia Speedway Park. Known as the "World's Fastest Half Mile," the Speedway is sure to "drive" more visitors along the byway.



The impressive facility, located in Barberville, operates both a 1/2-mile dirt oval and a 1/5mile dirt oval for karts. VSP hosts dirt track and go-kart racing events throughout the year, as well as the Dale & Emil Reutimann Memorial in November, the Sunshine Nationals in January, and the prestigious DIRTcar Nationals in February. 2023 marks the 52nd running of



the DirtCart Nationals Feb. 6-18, a marquee event for Sprint Cars, Late Models and Modifieds.

Five Big Gator Championship trophies will be handed out, while the iconic Golden Gator trophy will be awarded to every Feature winner. Overall Late Model and Super DIRTcar Series Big Gator champions will be crowned on Saturday, Feb. 18, to close out the last week of racing.

West Volusia Tourism, one of the tourism organizations that helps promote the byway and its attractions and events, is proud to announce it is now the "Preferred Travel Partner" of the Volusia Speedway Park.

Says Brian Carter, World Racing Group CEO: "Our fans and racers come from all over the world. This partnership helps us show them all the wonderful things there are to do throughout West Volusia, giving them even more of a reason to visit." The new partnership between Visit West Volusia and VSP began in July 2022.

Volusia Speedway Park has been hosting racing events since 1968. Originally built by Benny Corbin, VSP helped grow dirt racing in Volusia County. World Racing Group now owns and operates VSP, and airs its events live on its streaming platform DIRTVision.
