

BARBERVILLE YARD ART IS A LANDMARK ALONG THE BYWAY

"What IS this place?" visitors often ask when they drive just west of the intersection of State Road 40 and US Highway 17, along the Florida Black Bear National Scenic Byway.



Welcome to Barberville Yard Art Emporium, a true "Old Florida" roadside landmark for more than 30 years, located in between Daytona Beach and the Ocala National Forest. If you don't

stop the first time you pass the 20-foot giraffe, the chubby Big Boy or a mini Statue of Liberty, chances are you will on another trip. The owners estimate there are between 700,000 and 800,000 pieces of one-of-a-kind pieces of ornamental art found inside and outside at the three-acre attraction.

You'll find everything from recycled cast aluminum statuary to metal mailboxes to rustic teakwood furniture to local honey. There are



hundreds of Talavera Mexican pottery pieces in various shapes and sizes, as well a video in one area that tells of how Haitian artisans turn reclaimed oil drums into the colorful wall hangings and trinkets that adorn the Emporium.
